for Colossus...)

(And now you find in this poem

mini-clusters of 8 sentences,

each with 1 *H100* {*Hopper*} GPU
inside,

per platform.)

(8 sentences with 1 Nvidia HGX
H100 *platforms*

per rack {according to Grok}.)

(49 sentences, each with one *isle*,

consisting of 8

liquid cooled

racks from Supermicro.)

Right up to the stained glass
window.

(8 sentences, each with 1 *data hall*

with raised floor at the end

of the fibrous roll – of the
intense gaze,

of the tube.)

Below the eye

in the seam,

a huge shoe box

with shelves inside.

(1 sentence with 1 Colosseum
construction site.)

(At this point,

in this bracket,

there are 160 sentences, each with 1

frayed toilet roll

there’s a Daniel.

Every day, 1 trillion tokens of ‘scripture’

from the machine (according to Grok).

Thanks, Daniels.

I’ve ever written.

“How is that for Daniel?”

“For Daniel it is such that...”

Daniel:
